



Ersin Merdan has been working as an Energy Analyst at the Istanbul International Center for Energy and Climate (IICEC) since 2019. Merdan conducts research on strategies in energy markets as well as undertakes the quantitative and qualitative analysis of energy policy trends at the global, regional and country levels. Merdan also takes an active role in the activities of IICEC to enhance collaboration and dialogue with key stakeholders. He contributed to the IICEC Energy and Climate Research Review (2019) as one of the lead authors. He is also one of the authors of the Turkey Energy Outlook (2020), the flagship publication of IICEC.

Prior to joining IICEC, Ersin Merdan worked for the Turkish Finance Ministry Revenue Administration for three years. Having received a prestigious Jean Monnet Scholarship funded by the European Union, he completed an MSc program at King's College London in Eurasian Political Economy and Energy program in 2015. Subsequently, he was employed as an E&P and Natural Gas Market Specialist for over a year in a well-known NGO, the Petroleum Platform Association. From 2015 to 2019, he also worked as a freelance op-ed columnist, writing a weekly column for the state news agency and covering major issues related to energy sector.
